

APRIL 2020

Saturday 18 AUCKLAND – DUBAI

After meeting up in Auckland and our short pre-tour briefing we board our Emirates flight to Dubai.

Sunday 19 **DUBAI**

On arrival in Dubai early this morning we clear customs and immigration and transfer to our hotel.



We can check in straight away because we have booked an early check in.

The rest of the day is at leisure.

Monday 20 **DUBAI – ROME (D)**

This morning we travel to the airport for our flight to Rome. On arrival we transfer to our hotel.

There are so many things to do and see in Rome that if you would like to Mandy will take you walking in the streets around the hotel.

Tuesday 21 ROME (B)

We start the day with priority entrance to the Colosseum with our expert, professional guide. It's a jump into the history of the Roman Empire and the glory and power of the Caesars. Near the Colosseum (the largest amphitheatre in the world) we will continue on to the Roman Forum and Palatine Hill. It is here that Rome was



founded and here's hoping we can fill in the facts with some graphic images of how Rome looked when Julius and Nero walked the earth.

Unforgettable!

This afternoon is at leisure (but when is it ever completely empty when Mandy has an offering of things to see and places to go). There are so many iconic sites in Rome; we will do our best to make sure you see them all: Trevi Fountain, Pantheon, Piazza Navona, Spanish Steps and all those churches.

Wednesday 22 ROME (B,D)

A visit to Rome would not be complete without a visit to St Peters and Vatican City. Within this, the smallest country on the planet, are some of the finest art pieces of the Renaissance. Mandy has a few favourites but she would like to hear what delights your eye and stirs your heart.

Again we will be jumping the lines to get into the Vatican Museums when we arrive and are able to see the treasures without waiting for hours. The Vatican owns a lot of art so we intend to take in the Gallery of Tapestries, the



Geographical Maps and the beautiful Raphael's rooms before arriving at the famous Sistine Chapel.

After all this glorious art we will skip over to St Peter's Basilica where we avoid the long lines and have priority entrance.

In Italy, a basilica is a church where a body is buried, usually a very important body. Therefore when we are



at St Peter's we will enter the main church complex but also visit beneath to the crypt where the Popes are buried. Just for fun we may amuse ourselves by counting the number of times we see keys, the motif of St Peter (the keys of the Kingdom given to Peter).

Then we are going to take a trip outside the centre of Rome and visit the catacombs along the ancient Appian Way. Once upon a time this was the cemetery of Rome and it was here that many important Romans were buried, plus being a place where Christians met in secret.

There are some unusual traditions and customs which we hear about as we visit these underground cemeteries.

We have dinner at our hotel.

Thursday 23 ROME (B)

Today is a special day to make sure you get to see what you have always wanted to see in Rome. Some people like to visit Museums, or use the Hop On, Hop Off Bus, find a café for coffee and pizza or come along with Mandy to take in everything we haven't crossed off her list of Must-Do/See/Taste when in Rome.

Friday 24 **ROME – ASSISI (B,D)**

This morning we travel by coach to the Renaissance-style Villa d'Este, a gorgeous palatial setting surrounded by a spectacular terraced garden.

Villa d'Este is a masterpiece of Italian Gardens, decorated with a massive and impressive number of fountains, nymphes and grottos, inspired by the gardens of Babylon, one of the wonders of the ancient world. We are visiting here to see living art – the inspiration for many gardens which were created in England



after the 'Grand Tour' plus an excellent example of art maturing and continuing to bring pleasure even centuries after its creation.

We then travel on to Assisi. This tranquil place in Umbria is famous because of St Francis. However it has much to recommend it as it has a very special ambience and is a delight once all the passing tourists have gone. We will enjoy the quiet and the charming streets as night falls. The views across Umbria are breath-taking and here's hoping we find a nice drink, a comfortable chair and a panoramic view as sun sets.

We have dinner at our hotel. (Plus the delights of Lemoncello).

Saturday 25 ASSISI (B,L)

Today we are going to explore this medieval town with its massive Basilica of Saint Francis. (The important body in this church is the man himself.) The Basilica is beautifully decorated with frescoes which illustrate St Francis's



life. Not ego driven, St Francis had a simple approach to life which still inspires today.

Alongide St Francis was Santa Chiara (Clare) and we will also visit her Basilica and Santa Maria degli Angeli. We all know that San Francisco was named after St Francis and his order but did you know that Los Angeles was named after St Francis's original church of Maria and the Angels?

After all this art and history it will be time for lunch in a typical Italian restaurant.

This afternoon is at leisure, which means if you would like to go with Mandy she will be taking you for a walk outside the town walls and into the lovely countryside. Depending on your energy levels we can decide if you would like to visit Francis's small chapel up the hill or just enjoy a country walk on a less challenging terrain.

Sunday 26 ASSISI – VOLTERRA (B,L)

This morning we travel to Montepulciano, a Renaissance wine town built on volcanic rock. Many small Italian towns are sited on the top of hills where they could be defended or at the very least warned when the enemy was coming.



Today this means that the villages have superb views and fresh air. Whilst in Montepulciano we will enjoy wine tasting and lunch.

Afterwards we move on to Siena, a beautiful city who once competed against Venice and Florence for power, wealth and artistic beauties. If we can bring our attention away from the marvellous sights we may like to notice the winged lions, Siena's nod to Venice, and its way of saying we are as powerful as you are. We have a guided walking tour of the ancient town which includes the incredible Piazza del Campo, the main square. This huge space is used for the annual horse racing amongst rival neighbourhoods within the city. Surrounding the campo are numerous cafés, restaurants, shops and important buildings. Beyond the busy centre are quieter backstreets and we will learn everything about the Contrade, the 17 medieval city districts.

During our visit in Siena we will also have the opportunity to have a surprise tasting of a typical product. No prizes for guessing what that may be.

We then travel to Volterra, a small town on the top of a hill.

Monday 27 VOLTERRA (B)

Volterra has a long history and goes back before the Romans to the Estruscans. Little is known about these people but the art they left behind is wonderful. The day is for you to enjoy as you would like: museums, shopping, Roman Ruins or simply having some down time. However if you would like you can join Mandy on a walk around Volterra and see some of its highlights plus a yummy lunch.

The hotel we are staying at has a wonderful garden where we will gather for a drink and a catch-up as we watch the sun set over the Tuscan countryside.

Tuesday 28 **VOLTERRA – FLORENCE (B,L)**

What a day today is going to be as we are going to Florence — one of the most beautiful cities in the world. On the way we are going to pop into San Gimignano.

San Gimignano is renowned for its "medieval skyscrapers", high walls and narrow streets that typify most people's image of a Tuscan hill town. This



charming place has everything you would expect in a Tuscan town; cypress



lining the roads, walls encircling the town and unforgettable views across the valleys. After some free time in San Gimignano, we will taste some refreshing Gelato (Italian ice-cream) and fortify ourselves for a Wine Tour.

Let's face it; we are in Italy, we are also in Tuscany and what could be better than an intimate discovery of vineyards, olive groves and tasty cheeses. So, brace yourself; it's a feast for the senses as we work our way through wine scents and flavours. Some of the best wines ever produced have come from the hills just outside of Florence, thanks to the beautiful climate and the



rich soil, allowing these wineries to become top leaders in the industry for hundreds of years. This is an introduction to the quintessential Tuscan wines: the world-renowned Supertuscans. A Supertuscan is often the signature of the wine-producer. A precious wine that sometimes is difficult to find outside the latest vintage — or even to get a taste of.

We will visit three different wineries located amidst the rolling hills of the Chianti wine region. A sommelier will guide our experience as we taste and learn about the different methods of wine production in two famous wineries plus a family-run organic farm and winery.

Just to make sure we don't all get drunk on the wine tasting we will stop at a villa to enjoy a gourmet lunch in its "enoteca", (1000-year-old cellar). Specialties of the Tuscan cuisine and local products will be served with wine pairing.

At the end of the day we check in to our Florence hotel and we can all collapse into bed and dream of grapes and green hills.

Wednesday 29 FLORENCE (B,D)

Florence means Art and so what better place to start than the masterpieces in the Accademia Gallery. Once again we will skip the long entry lines and jump straight in to viewing David. Not only is he here in all his glory but there is also other pieces by Michelangelo plus some noted Renaissance artists.

Then we are going to take in the Uffizi Gallery (skipping long entrance lines). We can't leave Florence without visiting one of the most important art galleries



in the world. Here, we will admire numerous works of art by Botticelli, Michelangelo, Leonardo da Vinci, Raffaello, Giotto, Cimabue and Masaccio. Our local guide will let us in on the secrets of the Renaissance masterpieces for which the museum and Florence are famous.



Nearly every photo collection

of Florence includes the famous Duomo, its beautiful church. We are going to have a visit, covering more than 1,500 years of history, embracing all the monuments on the world-famous Cathedral of Santa Maria del Fiore, to the Brunelleschi's Dome, Giotto's Bell Tower, the St. John's Baptistery and the Museum of the Works. A unique chance to enjoy a truly exceptional cultural experience in the heart of Medieval and Renaissance Florence. There is a lot to take in from frescoes to brass work to oil paintings and the buildings themselves, but we will pace ourselves so we don't miss a thing and yet not be too overwhelmed.

For the more adventurous among us there is the climb up to the Museum panoramic terrace to admire the grandiose Dome up close.

Then we will all need a spot of refreshment so we walk a few steps from the Cathedral square, for a delicious taste of Chianti wine and tidbits of cheese with balsamic vinegar.

We have dinner at our hotel.

Thursday 30 FLORENCE (B,L)

Today is a very special day; a cooking class in Florence.

This master class is designed for our small group and we will have a hands-on experience of the scents, tastes and secrets of Italian cuisine.

We begin with discovering where Florentines buy their authentic gourmet Tuscan products and ingredients. Following our professional and passionate Chef, we will stroll through the old town looking for the historic Bottegas where we will learn about and taste some gourmet typical Tuscan products, as well as buying some of the freshest ingredients we will need for the recipes in our cooking class.

Then we reach our exclusive location for our cooking class, right in the heart of



Florence. Its now don the apron time as we listen to the Chef, and commence with the chopping, mixing, and kneading... required to make the most delicious lunch we've ever tasted.

The menu may slightly vary depending on the season and the fresh ingredients available, but there will be: home-made pasta from



scratch like Potato Gnocchi, with a hand-made Pesto sauce (no kitchen appliances, but pestles!), another hand-made pasta like Cannelloni Fiorentini (sort of crepes with a spinach and ricotta cheese filling, enriched with a fresh tomato sauce). And all of these will be made by us! A third recipe, like a typical Risotto dish, is also included, in a fascinating demonstration show of the Chef. And finally, we prepare our own dessert, like a Ricotta cheese mousse with different toppings.

Then we will eat our delicious creations, tasting some of the finest Tuscan wines.

Whether you are a beginner or an expert with the apron, it doesn't matter because we will all be in this experience together. Imagine how we will be able to impress friends and family when we get home with our Italian cooking. At this stage of the day its time for a rest, so back to the hotel.

MAY 2020

Friday 1

FLORENCE (B,D)

Yesterday was a full-on day so we are going to take it easy this morning with the official start to the day being mid afternoon. For those who wish to, Mandy will take you to some places in Florence and make sure you have seen the paper marbling and tasted some real Italian coffee in a street café. There are lots of other Museums in Florence for those who enjoy Museums, as well as the Piti Gardens across the river or even the numerous street markets where you may find a bargain.

This afternoon on the official programme we are going to learn how to make Pizza and Gelato just like the Italians do! This well known food is also a pleasure to make and our chef will help make the experience an enjoyable one.

First the pizza, which we cook in an oven, called pizzaiolo. We will learn how to make tender, flexible yeast dough that stretches to almost paper-thinness, and



even the trick for a flavourful yet light tomato sauce. Even if you bake pizza in your own oven, these techniques are universal and using them really makes a difference.

Then its gelato making time, Italy's favourite dessert. There is a bit more to the yummy treat so let's prepare ourselves to hear about the 'gelato culture' that continues to grow.

We will get to know the basic raw ingredients, how to select the best products available according to specific principles and we will have a presentation and tasting of some of the flavours used in gelato making. Then its time to learn about the development and application of natural colours, the heating and freezing techniques and how they have different effects on ingredients. It is always a great day to discover the recipe of this beloved dessert!

Saturday 2 FLORENCE – BOLOGNA (B,L)

Our last chance to take in the beauty of Florence as we are off to Bologna today. Our introduction to Bologna and its incredible food is with lunch at an excellent local restaurant.

This afternoon we are joined by a local guide for a walking tour of this great city. The highlight will be visiting the Basilica San Petronio on Piazza Maggiore and the Archiginnasio Palace – Europe's first University. The walls of the courtyard and staircases are covered with crests and heraldic symbols. Included in a our visit is the historic Anatomical Theatre.


In the evening we will discover our own café or trattoria around Piazza

Maggiore and Piazza Nettuno for a memorable meal. After all, this is Italy's gourmet capital!

Sunday 3 BOLOGNA (B)

As Bologna is famous for its cuisine it is appropriate we have a walking food tour. We will get to see the local markets and taste the freshest of produce. Our task for today will be 'Which is my favourite food ingredient'?

There is much to do and see in Bologna; if you would like to join Mandy she will do her best to make sure you walk some of the delicious food off and also discover a fun place for dinner tonight.





Monday 4 BOLOGNA (B,L)

After breakfast, we meet our English-speaking guide for a tour in the Bologna countryside.

We will visit a Parmigiano Reggiano dairy with tastings of different cheeses. Then its on to a Prosciutto factory where we will enjoy a guided tour and tasting.

Believe it or not after all this tasting it will be time for lunch where we will be treated to a typical Italian meal.

After lunch we head off to a vinegar factory to finish off the day with understanding about the variety and tastes of this important cuisine ingredient.

Tuesday 5 **BOLOGNA: excursion to Venice (B,D)**

This morning we travel to Venice by coach.

What a day we have exploring the highlights of this famous city through the most characteristic and



important places for its history. Once the richest Italian city with its trade along the Silk Road, the patrons made their city into a monument to Renaissance architecture and art. There is something very special about the Piazza San Marco and its origins. We will also make sure we take in the Basilica San Marco, Palazzo Ducale, Bell Tower, Clock Tower and Procuratie. An unforgettable excursion not to be missed!

We have a local guide and entrance tickets to the Doge's Palace and St. Mark's Basilica.

Then its some free time so we can fulfil life-long dreams of a gondola ride or simply getting lost in the streets and bridges of Venice.

After our lovely visit to Venice its back to Bologna and our Farewell Dinner at a first class local restaurant. We will be such experts now on Italian food and wine that we can expect some humorous stories of past cooking and tasting experiments.

Wednesday 6 BOLOGNA – DUBAI (B)

This morning is at leisure and then we transfer to Bologna airport for our flight to Dubai.



We have an overnight in Dubai before we return to the airport tomorrow morning.


